Gary Krebs'™ Foam Popper Jigs for Saltwater and Bass - Instructions

1. Set includes: Jigs for 1/2, 7/16, and 3/8 inch popper heads, one cutting blade, one leg needle.
CAUTION: THE BLADE AND NEEDLE ARE VERY SHARP – PLEASE KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.
2. Insert the desired size foam tube into the corresponding jig as shown

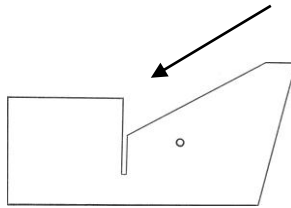


3. Push the foam tube into the jig until it meets the edge of the vertical cut in the jig, as shown. Insert the leg needle.



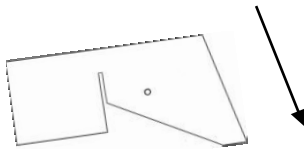
4. Using the blade with a slight sawing motion, and keeping the blade at a flat angle to avoid cutting into the jig, make the back face cut, as shown.

Cut this face first

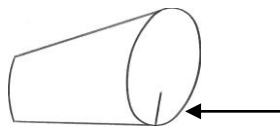


5. Turn the jig over and use the blade to make the front face cut.

Make this cut next



6. Remove the leg needle and push the popper head out toward the front of the jig with a blunt object.
7. On the underside of the popper head, make a straight vertical cut 3/16 of an inch deep along the entire length, as shown.



Make a 3/16 inch deep cut on underside of head

8. To mount the head to the hook, wrap the hook shank with tying thread and coat with an ample amount of cyanoacrylate (CA) glue, such as Zap-a-Gap® or Super Glue®. Squeeze the popper head so that the slit in the underside opens as wide as possible. Position the head onto the hook and release. Allow glue to dry. Using the leg needle, insert rubber legs through the hole created in Step 3. Finish the remaining parts of the popper as desired.
